PROGRAMS AND SERVICES

Environmental Public Health

Helps to protect the health and wellness of our community through routine monitoring, education, surveillance, and sampling of facilities and conditions.

- Biomedical waste inspections
- Body piercing, tanning, tattoo, and permanent cosmetic inspections
- Onsite sewage permitting programs
- Food safety inspections for schools, recreational camps, fraternal and civic organizations, detention facilities, as well as some bars and lounges

School-Based Dental Sealants

Provides no-cost dental sealants and other services to Citrus children in all Title 1 elementary and middle schools in Citrus County.

Disease Control

Provides services, investigation, surveillance, and prevention to protect public health. When an infectious disease is reported, staff investigate to find the source and eliminate the spread.

Emergency Preparedness and Response

Works to enhance preparedness and response efforts and education to support public health emergencies that can affect the health and safety of residents and visitors.

Special Needs Shelters

During emergencies, employees staff the special needs shelter, located at Forest Ridge Elementary School in Hernando, for residents who are medically stable but need help with basic tasks or use of an electronic medical device and have no other emergency evacuation option.

Immunizations

Provides immunizations for vaccine-preventable diseases. DOH-Citrus offers immunizations for children at no cost. Adult immunizations are provided for a fee.
